What is Illinois College2Career?

Vision:

 Understand impact of higher education programs on career outcomes of graduates of IL colleges by connecting workforce data to college and university data.

Strategy:

- Transparency: Ensure high school students and parents can make more informed choices about post-secondary options based on real employment and educational outcomes in Illinois.
- Mobile-first approach: Design public-facing portal for smart-phone usage so high school students and parents have faster access.
- Feedback loops to colleges and universities: Ensure colleges and universities in Illinois can analyze their own data to inform their program offerings

One tool, two portals

ILCollege2Career

- Target Audience: High school students and parents
- Interface: Public-facing tool
- Innovations:
 - Responsive to student's preferences
 - Public and private
 Universities included
 - 2- and 4-year institutions included
 - Career outcomes are by program at institutions
 - Career outcomes include average earnings, job stability, and average earnings growth

Institutional Researcher Portal

- Target Audience: Institutional staff at colleges and universities
- Interface: Non-public facing
- Innovations:
 - Microdata access allows institutions to have new information about student outcomes that can improve programming and supports
 - Outcomes are based on jobs held by graduates, to better understand career jobs, job stability, and multiple job holdings

Tracking our impact: Short-Term Outreach Goals

January Over 800 IL high schools provided information 2019 **125** IL high schools with tool linked on website or social media 375 rural IL high schools provided information **February** 100% of 60x25 Network Trainings provided 2019 1,000 IL high school counselors provided June information 2019 400 IL high schools trained September 1,000 users per month 2019 100% of ROEs trained

Tracking out impact: Long-Term Performance Goals

Baselines

Reduce outmigration of IL graduates

- 45.7% of Illinois high school graduates out-migrated to 4-year schools in 2016, a **3.1% increase since 2014** (42.6%) .
- Between 2010-2013, IL 2-year schools have seen an increase in transfer graduate outmigration to 4year schools from 8.1% in to 8.8%

Increased earnings of IL graduates


Graduates of IL 2-year colleges show earnings growth of 48% two years after graduation, and 85% four years after graduation.

Graduates of IL 4-year institutions show earnings growth of 92% two years after graduation.

More demanddriven programs
offered at IL high
education
institutions

- From 2010-2016, the number of STEM and Health degrees awarded at Illinois institutions increased by 29.4%.
- Goal to maintain +2% annual increase in the number of STEM and Health Degrees awarded in future years.

Challenges Faced

- 1. Procurement
- 2. Governance and Decision Making
- 3. Communication
- 4. Data Availability

Resolution to Challenge

- 1. Flexibility with project requirements and constant communication
- 2. Consensus building and formal voting
- 3. Project team retreats
- 4. Learning to not let the perfect get in the way of the good

Lesson Learned for Future Projects

- A third-party, neutral, project manager can help overcome silos and misunderstandings, and keep the timeline on-track
- Develop a collaborative governance system that allows all voices equal weight for discussions and decisions
- Think about the tools needed to pull off project early and ensure procurement is engaged early in the process
